With ten minutes to go, Chesterfield were forced into throwing more players forward and the pressure  finally told when Evo found a killer pass to pick out Beardo in front of goal to score.

Chesterfield should have had a penalty stroke moments later when the Mansfield defender's sliding tackle prevented Beardo a goal scoring opportunity, but it didn't prove crucial as Dutch scored from the resulting penalty corner with a powerful shot that the goalie could only parry into the roof of the net.

LICHFIELD 2 CHESTERFIELD 2 (AWAY)

 hesterfield dropped two points against a struggling inexperienced Lichfield side, who were unlucky not to grab all three points by scoring their only two chances in the game. The visitors started brightly as the Lichfield defence dropped back and gave title contenders Chesterfield some respect, but after Mixo had a penalty stroke appeal turned down and Macca put a couple of crosses into the circle that went begging at the far post, Lichfield settled into the game.

The remainder of the first half was of poor quality as both sides continuously failed to keep possession of the ball to create chances with errant passing and bad first touch. Chesterfield were lucky not to have Brocklehurst and Hartley sin-binned for a bad tackle and the illegal control of an overhead ball.

In the second half it looked as if the visitors may take control of the game after they took the lead when Bointon's pass down the right wing allowed Mixo to brake into the circle and feed Anderson to turn the keeper in front of goal and score from a narrow angle.

But the poor passing continued and eventually a turnover in midfield allowed Lichfield to get a shot off at the top of the circle and have players queuing up at the far post to tap the ball into the net.

Lichfield's second goal soon followed in a similar manner after possession was given away in midfield and the left winger found some luck after his mis-hit effort looped over the helpless Matt Lloyd and bounced into the goal.

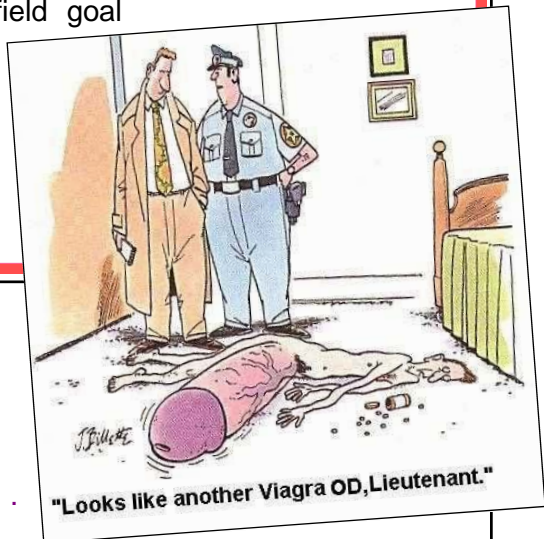

A brilliant passing move down the left wing that involved 6 or more players would have resulted in one of the goals of the season but a last ditch tackle in front of goal prevented Macca from scoring. Charlie Grant ignored the wide open Beardo in the circle in order to score his first of the season with an outrageous reverse stick shot; unsurprisingly, he missed the target by a long way.

Another break down the left gave Beardo the time to pick out Parky in the circle and his cool finish into the bottom left made it seven and then Mixo made it eight from close range after another good passing move beat the now broken Bridgnorth defence.

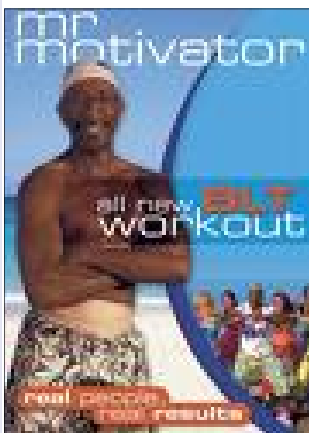

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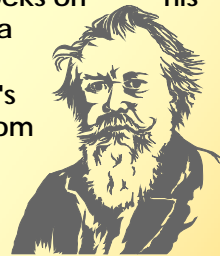
.... a little bit of Peace & Quiet

"Great", says Tom, "after six months out here I'm ready to meet some local folks. Thank you."

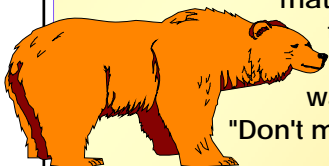
As Cliff is leaving, he stops. "Gotta warn you. Be some drinkin'."

Season 1968-9 (Part 1)

Avid readers of **SCOOP** will no doubt recall that the 1st XI ended the season 1967-8 without having lost a game. Their magnificent achievement of having played 26 games, winning 22 and drawing 4 whilst scoring 91 goals and conceding only 11, a long standing Club record, was clearly going to be a hard act to follow. Furthermore, the team was much weakened by the departure of Sagoo, a formidable inside-right and Bill Godfrey (my England Schoolboy International hero) an even more formidable right-wing or devastating left-wing.



They opened the season on Saturday 7th September 1968 with weekend home matches at the Queen's Park Annexe against Appleby and Ilford. Both games were won decisively with scores of 3-0 & 4-0 respectively. On the following Saturday, another home game against the 'old enemy' Rotherham turned out to be a dour battle between two sides determined not to give much away. However, two goals by Captain Bill Wattleworth, the second of which was reputedly one of the best seen at the Annexe for some time, was a beautifully placed lob (or more correctly a scoop) from the edge of the circle into the top corner of the net. Rotherham although fighting hard throughout the match were unable to score themselves. Elsewhere the 2nd XI and 3rd XI sides were playing Rotherham and won 2-1 & 2-0 respectively. A very good day indeed to achieve a clean sweep against this particular club.

On the 21st September the first-teamers were given a real fright by the 2nd XI in the annual Club match and for the whole of the first half, the seconds played as well as any first team. They effectively held the first team attack and frequently caused concern in the circle and deservedly went into the lead when John Mitchell converted a half-chance by intelligent running and a good shot. This lead was maintained well into the second half

until Tony Weir equalized from a penalty corner. Shortly afterwards Wattleworth put the first team into the lead when he deflected another Weir penalty corner. Towards the end the same player added a third goal following a John Haywood run down the right. On the same afternoon the 3rd XI lost away to North Notts 1-7.

The last week of September was another clean sweep with the 1st XI beating Burton at the Annexe 1-0, although the game never reached the heights expected. The seconds beat Burton 2nd XI 2-1 away and the thirds beat Notts Gregory 2-1 at Walton Dam.

On Saturday 5th October the 1st XI, unbeaten for two years, were brought back to reality by a no-nonsense Derby 1st XI team which secured a 3-0 home win. The 2nd XI match at Stanton was cancelled, whilst the thirds beat Derby at the Annexe 1-0 and the fourths, much strengthened by four 2nd XI players beat Chesterfield School at Walton Dam 2-0. The next day was the Derby Tournament when the 2nd XI, one of the very few second teams competing, took most of the honours by coming second in a very strong group losing only to Hathersage 1st XI. Although not losing a match the first team were pipped for top place by Rolls Royce 1st XI. (Note later results)

The following week was another clean sweep this time against Players with wins of 3-0, 2-0 & 9-0 respectively.

The 19th October was the Club's innovative six-a-side tournament, which turned out to be an enjoyable success. In the first league, no team could exert its superiority with each side losing one game. As the goal average was the same, the "Jam Yams", captained by John Booth, went through into the final. In the other league the "Pinta" men won through. The final was closely-fought and at full-time the scores were even, by the

"Jam Yams" equalizing with just seconds to go. The result was decided by penalty strokes, with the "Pinta" eventually winning through. The last games of the month against Belper produced a 2-0 away win for the 1st XI with 1-1 draws for the seconds and thirds; unfortunately the 4th XI game against Derby School was cancelled.

November should have started with all teams playing Nottingham University but in the event all matches were cancelled, a not too unfamiliar situation in those days. The following week was the return fixtures against the 'old enemy' Rotherham. In a 2-2 draw, noted more for inept control rather than good hockey, the 1st XI were unlucky not to win but had they done so it would have been unfortunate for Rotherham who suffered as much as the home side from bad decisions. In the second half, although reduced to 10 men by injury, Rotherham fought hard and scored three times through defensive errors. Generally, this was a poor Chesterfield performance from a team lacking fitness and fight. On a home ground that was muddy but firm on the wings, the 3rd XI dominated the game from start to finish and won 3-0.

On 16th November the 1st XI visited Hathersage and earned themselves a tame 1-1 draw on a pitch that prevented any immediate or prolonged control of the ball. The 2nd XI, clearly smarting from their previous week's misery and ineptitude, turned out a good performance and outclassed their Hathersage opponents winning comfortably 5-1. The thirds lost away to Sheffield Bankers 1-0 and the 4th XI drew 3-3 at Stanton. The following week saw another Club innovation when an Under-30s team played an Over-30s team - unfortunately I do not appear to have the result of this match but I do recall playing for the Under-30s.

In the final week of November the Club almost achieved another clean sweep against a long established Nottinghamshire side, West Bridgford Old Boys (WBOB) by respectively winning 0-1 away, 3-0 home, losing 0-2 away & winning 2-1 at home.

Presswoods Journal-"Forty Years Ago

On a damp Annexe pitch, the opening December game against Rolls Royce was played at a cracking pace for most of the first half. Neither side could really get a grip on the game and both defences were extended and severely tested. However, it was a most unfortunate mis-kick by goalie, Bud Nightingale, which led to the visitors taking the lead from a situation that should not have led to a goal. This misfortune spurred Chesterfield on to play some excellent hockey and they began to gain territorial advantage and Rolls Royce were pushed back. It was no surprise when Peter Danbury (Joe Danbury's son) fastened on to a through ball and hammered a rising shot into the net. The game finished with Rolls Royce coming more into the picture as Chesterfield tired but on the whole the home side had more chances but could not finish as well as they approached. The 2nd XI drew 1-1 with Rolls Royce 2nd XI who had not lost that season and the 3rd XI beat them 2-1 in a match which was spoiled by a very soft home pitch.



In the following week, the 1st XI extended their unbeaten home record to the quarter century mark with a 1-1 draw against Worksop. The second team defeated Worksop 2nd XI very easily with an away 3-0 win. Chesterfield 3rd XI defeated a Worksop 3rd XI by the only goal of the match, scored by Astle, who sent the 'keeper the wrong way with a beautiful dummy before netting the ball. The standard of hockey was good but finishing by both sides was erratic. However, Graham Marsden in the Chesterfield goal played an excellent game and time after time it was only his excellent work which prevented Worksop equalizing. On the 28th December 1968, the Club played its traditional Yuletide fixtures against Hathersage. The 1st XI after narrowly avoiding defeats in their previous

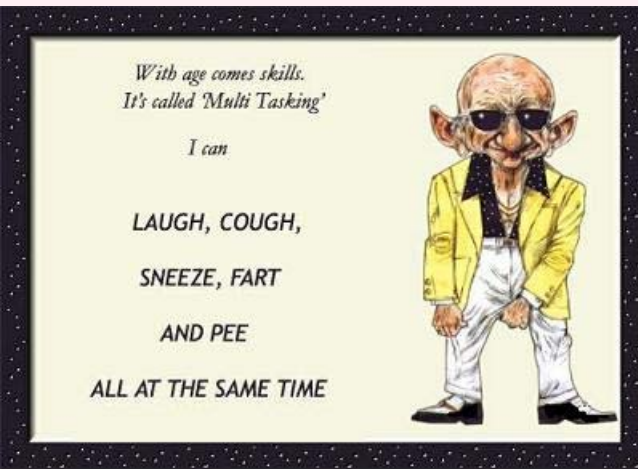

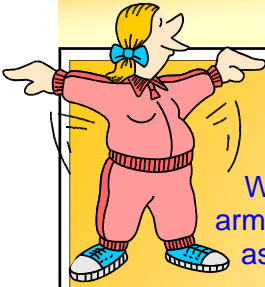

With a 5-lb potato sack in each hand, extend your arms straight out from your sides and hold them there as long as you can.

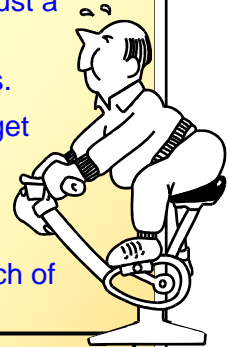
Try to reach a full minute, and then relax.

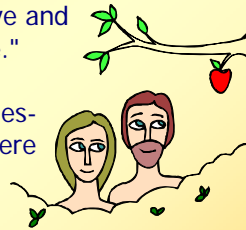
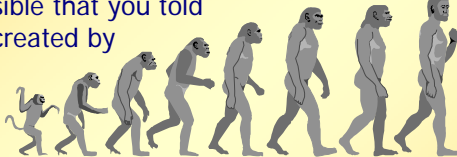
